**50th Anniversary of “Shoot Down Day” Commemorates a Story of
Heroism and Perseverance
Stockdale Tribute at NTC Liberty Station Honors Courageous Navy Family**

Shoot Down Day Anniversary, September 9, 2015

San Diego, CA- (August 31, 2015) - Did you know that the POW- MIA flag that has become so iconic in American history was created here in San Diego? That’s just one part of the “story for the ages” chronicling how Coronado navy wife Sybil Stockdale worked tirelessly to fight for the rights of American prisoners missing in Southeast Asia. One soldier especially close to her heart was Vice Admiral James Stockdale, who was shot down behind enemy lines on **September 9, 1965**.

Retired Vice Admiral James Stockdale (December 23, 1923 – July 5, 2005) was one of the most highly decorated officers in the history of the US Navy and the highest ranking POW’s in Vietnam. A remarkable hero and leader, he spent over seven years as a prisoner of war.

The Stockdale Tribute at the Dick Laub NTC Command Center at NTC Liberty Station - the former Naval Training Center- pays tribute to their story with memorabilia, photographs, and portraits. In addition, the Sybil Stockdale Rose Garden in honor of Navy Families invites guest to wander, enjoy and reminisce. Roses played an important role in secret messages that were shared between Sybil and Jim while he was imprisoned.

Throughout his life, the love and support of Adm. Stockdale shared with his wife Sybil, were an essential part of his many accomplishments and were documented in their book, “In Love and War: the Story of a Family’s Ordeal and Sacrifice During the Vietnam War.”

As a unique destination that both honors the region’s Navy heritage and today showcases innovation and creativity, NTC@Liberty Station is the perfect place to celebrate the lives of a courageous American couple, Jim and Sybil Stockade. “For more than 75 years, this base served our nation with pride. On the occasion of the 50th anniversary of the day Vadm Stockade was shot down over North Vietnam, we honor and commemorate the lives of two Americans whose service to our country was truly remarkable,” said **RADM Fran Holian**. Radm Holian is a NTC Foundation Board member and a former Navy Region Southwest Commander (sometimes referred to as the “Navy Mayor”). “We are proud to commemorate this historic day. The Stockdale’s incredible story of heroism, trust and family commitment cannot be told enough. We’re proud to share their family story with the community.”

The Stockdale Tribute, originally dedicated in 2008, has been a true community initiative, led by individuals and corporations dedicated to the transformation of the NTC Commanding Officer's Headquarters into the new NTC Command Center. An exhibit telling the story of Point Loma and its role as the Gateway to San Diego.

An exhibit honoring Stockdale's Legacy will also be opening at the Coronado History Museum on September 18.
